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## AFTER A DISASTER

**DO be patient. DO** slow down. If an earthquake, pull over if shaking starts again.

DO turn on the radio for emergency bulletins

(such as KGO 810, KCBS 740, and KLIV 1590)

- DO proceed cautiously (if safe to do so).
- DO obey "road closed" signs.
- DO yield to repair and emergency vehicles.
- **DO NOT** attempt to cross damaged roads.
- **DO NOT** go near downed power lines.
- **DO NOT** stop under underpasses or on bridges.
- **DO NOT** drive through water.
- **DO NOT** abandon your car, except if it is unsafe to stay with it. (If you must abandon it, you should not leave it in a traffic lane. If forced to abandon it in a traffic lane, you should leave your keys in it.)



## AFTER A DISASTER IF YOU ARE AT HOME -

DO turn on the radio for emergency bulletins (such as KGO 810, KCBS 740, and KLIV 1590)
DO stay at home so that repair and emergency vehicles can travel more easily.

**DO** keep calm!

DO NOT drive. Many roads will be closed.
